Next Thursday, May 21, starting at 8 p.m., The Vine is hosting "Tunes for A New Dawn," a night of music, barbecue and special drinks, with all proceeds, including the bar staff's tips, going to Dawn. There will be a raffle and an auction as well. All of the proceeds go to Rosa.

Then, May 28 at 8 p.m, at The Hub is hosting "Down and Dirty Tunes for a New Dawn," an evening of live music with beer, wine and tequila specials. All proceeds from beer, wine, and tequila specials will go to Rosa.
